# **Annual School Report for the Academic Year 2022-23**

## **Learning Approach:**

### **Academics:**

#### **Assessments:**

#### Grades 1 to 10

- The academic session (2022-23) comprised of two terms. Term I (PT-1 and midterm) and Term II (PT -2 and Final).
- In each Term continuous and comprehensive evaluation is done for all the subjects. We ensure that learning outcomes are covered in both the Terms, Qualitatively and Quantitatively.
- The suggested activities are assessed by the subject teachers on the basis of rubrics.
- The Final Exam is the point of reference to assess a student's overall yearly performance.

## Grades 9 and 10

We follow the CBSE curriculum pattern and cover the complete syllabus in the final examination.

The school counsellor is actively engaged in providing students with the academic guidance thereby helping students understand their learning needs and blocks, resolving the everyday issues with peers, identifying the behavioral problem, coordinating with teachers, parents, and the administration.

Our **Special Educator** caters to needs of the students with developmental disabilities ranging from mild to severe needs.

## **Events:**

The academic year began with connecting with the parents of all grades through the medium of the **Parent Orientation Programme**, designed to give a detailed insight into the teaching methodology adopted by the school, calendar of the events and many more and also seeking collaborative approach from the parent body towards the continual learning process.
