Learning approach: Academics

Gr. 1 to 8

- The academic session [2023–24] comprised of 2 terms–
- term 1 [periodic test 1 and mid term] and
- term 2 [periodic test 2 and final exam]
- In each term–Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) was done for all subjects.
- Learning outcomes were covered in both the terms qualitatively and quantitatively
- Activities were given in all subjects and the teachers assessed them on the basis of rubrics.
- The final exam projected the students over all yearly performance.

- CBSE curriculum is strictly followed and the entire syllabus was covered for the final examination/ board exam.

School Counselor and Special Educator
